In this dynamic role, you will design and execute innovative educational programs, workshops, and community outreach initiatives that spark curiosity, foster creativity, and promote inclusivity. You will collaborate closely with Museum curator, Director of Public Programs, SVMoA Learning & Engagement educators and contract instructors, as well as community partners, to develop engaging curricula, interpretive materials, and measurable learning goals aligned with the Museum's exhibitions.

Key Responsibilities:

- Conceive of and design immersive educational experiences that captivate diverse audiences, from K-12 students and educators to lifelong learners, both on-site and through outreach efforts.
- Nurture strong relationships with all schools in Blaine County, educators, artists, and community organizations to cultivate meaningful collaborations and arts integration opportunities in Blaine County classrooms.
- Oversee the development and implementation of exhibition tours, art classes, workshops, and events for adults, teens, and families, ensuring exceptional quality and relevance.
- Manage the SVMoA Scholarship program, leading ongoing improvements and expanding opportunities for educators and students in the Wood River Valley.
- Lead the Learning & Engagement team, providing guidance, professional development, and inspiring a culture of creativity and continuous learning.
- Evaluate program effectiveness through assessments and data analysis, using insights to refine and enhance our offerings continuously.
- Support diverse learning styles and motivations by building opportunities for socialemotional learning, intellectual rigor, and whimsical experimentation in gallery spaces.
- Liaise with the Learning & Engagement Board Committee.
- Undertake occasional travel for Professional Development and research to ensure emerging trends and best practices inform learning pedagogies.

Administrative Responsibilities:

- Supervise, motivate, and provide ongoing feedback for direct reports; manage staff work plans; catalyze individual and departmental goals.
- Serve as an Ambassador for Learning & Engagement Programs for donors, funders, and external stakeholders as requested.

• Actively pursue funding opportunities and collaborate with the Advancement team to secure grants and sponsorships for educational programs.

• Manage budgets, contracts, and administrative tasks related to Learning & Engagement initiatives with efficiency and accountability.

- Proficiency in Spanish is a plus.
